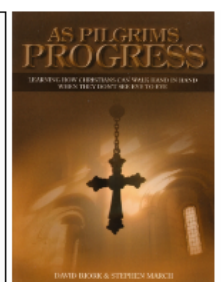
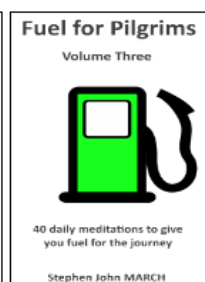
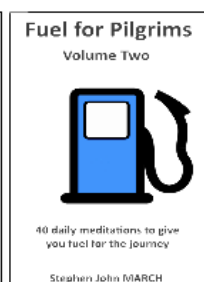

Joshua is still on track with his PhD. He is about to go to Munich to meet up with a psychology professor there to discuss his thesis. He will present his first paper at an international psychology conference this summer, and is also going to be on the panel at a psychology symposium - all of which are really good for his future career.

Caleb has passed his 'Gardien de la Paix' competitive entrance exams! He has now filled in all the forms to go off to undertake training to become the French equivalent of a police constable.
